### Chatham Township Environmental Commission (CTEC) July 2010 Backyard Composter Program



### What is Backyard Composting?

Composting is nature's way of recycling! It is a process of recycling decomposed organic materials into a rich soil known as compost. Anything that was once living will decompose. Basically, backyard composting is an acceleration of the same process nature uses. If you have a balance of fallen leaves or straw (we call "browns") and kitchen food scraps and grass clippings (we call "greens"), then you have all you need to make compost. Finished compost looks like soil–dark brown, crumbly and smells like a forest floor.

10 good reasons why you should compost:

- 1. Yard and food waste make up 30% of the waste stream. Composting your kitchen and yard trimmings helps divert that waste from the landfill, waterways and water treatment facilities.
- 2. You will significantly reduce pest problems-and your use of pesticides.
- 3. Healthy plants and lawns from healthy soil look better, produce better and have a much greater ability to fight off pests and diseases.
- 4. Adding organic materials to the soil improves moisture retention and this saves you water, watering time, and money.
- 5. Adding decomposed organic material to the soil feeds beneficial organisms.
- 6. Compost amends both sandy and clay soils.
- 7. Compost provides a balanced, slow–release source of nutrients that helps the soil hold nutrients long enough for plants to use them.
- 8. Composting saves money-you avoid the cost of buying soil conditioners, bagged manure etc. and you save on your water bills!
- 9. Feeding your plants well will improve your own diet. Plants grown in depleted soils have a reduced nutrient content.
- 10. Home composting is a valuable tool in educating children about nature and the cycle of life.

### **IMPORTANT NOTE**: There is a difference between a compost**<u>er</u>** and a compost <u>**pile**</u>.

**Backyard compost<u>ers</u>**--enclosed containers--are allowed to be used in Chatham Township and Chatham Borough—there are no ordinances (laws) or regulations prohibiting the proper use and maintenance of a composter. No permits or etc. are required. The composters featured our "Save it to Spade it" Program enable our residents to add leaves, grasses, vegetable food scraps, coffee grinds, and many other kinds of "kitchen/food" waste (except meats and dairy items), because the composter has turning capability, cover, and locking mechanisms.

\***Open "compost <u>piles</u>**"-- although good for "yard waste" like grass and leaves—are open, accessible, and usually are not turned periodically, so no "kitchen/food waste" is allowed in "compost piles" per ordinance (laws) in our area.

### Good for Kitchen Compost:

- Vegetables and vegetable scraps
- Fruits, rinds, and peels
- Breads and cereals (no butter/milk/dairy on these)
- Coffee grounds and filters
- Tea bags
- Egg shells (some people rinse w/ hot water or micro-wave to remove protein residue)
- Paper napkins
- Grains and pasta (no butters/sauces on these)

### NO meat/poultry, dairy, or other animal products; no oils
